## Just like a plant... sleep, creep, LEAP!!! Recycled Gardens takes off in '04

This is our third year of business at Recycled Gardens and just like a three-year-old plant we're taking off. Our Spring No Foolin Plant Sale and Garden Art Show was NUTS! Saturday morning the parking lot and front hayfield were full of cars, as was the orchard. Folks were parking all along Cornelius Pass Road and walking in. It got kinda hazardous.... so bad, in fact, I was afraid the Police were gonna show up and start directing traffic. If they had I'm sure they would have charged us for the service!

I'm sure the picture-perfect weather helped to put everybody in high spirits, which was good because even though we were lucky enough to have several unscheduled volunteers show up to help out, we were still running like crazy from stockpile to stockpile of plants cashing people out. And people really were in buying mode, seems there were a lot of holes in everybody's gardens this Spring after the New Year's snow storm did in those marginal plants they were cultivating over several warm Winters, so folks were snapping up our great hardy plants right and left. Of course it didn't hurt that everything was only \$3 a gallon, plus at least a hundred people brought along the FREE plant coupon from the Spring newsletter. The really good news is, even with reduced prices and freebies our take that day was \$14,625!!! Last year we only made \$6,266 for the entire weekend.

The gross total for the weekend was \$20,701... more than enough to pay the consignment artists, pay back the Oregon Neutermobile account the \$4K we'd borrowed to fund Winter spay/neuter's, buy new signs and gravel for the nursery, and pay off all the shrubs, fruit and shade trees we bought at a nursery closeout. So we still aren't rich, but we have money in the bank to continue our fight against animal over-population by funding spay/neuter surgeries for companion animals.

When our Spring newsletter came out, our independently contracted, expert and caring surgeons had spayed or neutered 2,200 cats, dogs and rabbits on the RV. We were just getting started in Umatilla County, where the goal was to see 800 patients altered. I'm pleased to announce that with ample help from our hosts, Pendleton Humane Society and Preventing Euthanasia Through Schooling (PETS), we surpassed our goals, and our tally to date stands at 3,762!!!

## **Look for Opportunities to Volunteer Efforts**

My wife and I are from Hermiston and we took two of our dogs to the Pioneer **Humane Society's** Neutermobile last weekend in Pendleton. We were surprised when they were short on volunteers and instantly we offered to help. It was a real neat experience to be part of this truly important event. Many times that day I said you learn something new every day. Everyone should try to do more volunteer work, it really makes you feel good, and these days that feeling can't be taken for granted.

And also published during our Umatilla visit, Lois O'Donnell wrote in after our Dr Matlock spayed a 6 yr old poodle just in time to remove the deadly infection that was building up in her uterus (called pyometra, a life-threatening concern for intact dogs and cats). Our surgeons see a lot of pyometra and the scariest part is that it's difficult to tell before surgery that the animal is in danger. Yet another reason not to delay, spay today:

## **Spay/neuter clinic saves poodle's life**

The first weekend of April the Pioneer Humane Society put on the spay and neuter clinic that ended up saving my life. Mom said I was too old to have babies so Saturday morning we went to the clinic where the volunteers were great to mom and me. The doctor that was working with me found that I was full of a life-threatening infection. When mom came for me she held me so the volunteers could take care of the other pets, and this was when mom was told about me.

I'm telling you all this because, I didn't know I was sick. Friday I was out chasing squirrels around the yard having a good ol' time and taking naps with the cats next door thinking life couldn't get any better than this. If the Pioneer Humane Society's clinic hadn't spotted the infection and dealt with it so efficiently, Mom said I could have died. I just want to thank the Pioneer Humane Society and ON for what they do for us pets.

## **Oregon Neutermobile to Return**

The Oregon Neutermobile will return in June to once again address the tremendous need for spaying/neutering in Coos County.

ON offers pet owners access to low-cost veterinary spay/neuter services. In Coos County last year, 873 pets were altered, half at additional discounts for pet owners in financial need.

During the Neutermobile's 2003 stay, the demand was overwhelming. "We even turned cats away on the last day," said Clinic Coordinator Shawn Gayhart. "There are just so many unneutered pets in Coos County! Even if our local vets could do surgery for free, they still wouldn't have enough hours in the day to make a dent in the numbers of homeless animals that end up at our County Shelter.

The Oregon Neutermobile is a division of Pet Over-Population Prevention Advocates. They have no paid staff, only contracted veterinarians and vet technicians.

The Neutermobile's vet this time will be Dr. Alissa Forster, presently working as a field service veterinarian in North Dakota, as well as spay/neuter clinics hosted by a local group, and doing rescue work for both domestic animals and wildlife. She did master's work at the Oregon Institute of Marine Biology in Charleston and received her VMD from the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine in 1994.

ON's clients are urged to visit their local vet for health checks and vaccinations. Kittens and male puppies at least 8 weeks old and weighing more than 2 pounds can be done, as well as females in heat or pregnancy at no extra charge. Lactating females with young at least 5 weeks old can be done. Feral cats will not be turned away.

Looking ahead, we're currently recruiting technicians to work July/August in Eugene, hosted by Stray Cat Alliance. Job description on our website, [www.neutermobile.org](http://www.neutermobile.org).

Eugene has already paid their deposit and desperately needs a visit, as there are virtually no accessible, low cost spay/neuter options in Eugene, and no county shelter for cats.
